SWISS-TYPE AUTOMATIC LATHE MUSEUM

In the heart of the industrial zone of Moutier is a building that houses witnesses to the industrial history of the town. This mansion (1895) belonged to Nicolas Junker, founder of the automatic lathe industry in Moutier. Today it is a museum with an important collection relating the industrialization and history of Moutier. The museum retraces the history of the famous automatic lathe from 1872 to the present day through a hundred or so automatic lathes and a rich documentation.
