# ROCHERS DES SOMMÈTRES

## GOOD TO KNOW

- Access on foot only
- Sturdy, non-slip hiking shoes are strongly recommended: the trail includes steps carved into the rock, which can become slippery when wet
- A shelter for climbers and hikers was built by the Groupe d'Alpinistes des Franches-Montagnes (GAFM). It is accessible on foot from Muriaux (yellow trail markings, direction Le Noirmont) or from Le Noirmont (direction Saignelégier). Allow approximately 45 minutes of walking from either village
- The trail is steep, with some sections made of rock-carved stairs. Watch children carefully near the passage to Les Roches des Sommètres. The path is not accessible to strollers or people with reduced mobility
- Access is not recommended in icy conditions for safety reasons
- Wear weather-appropriate clothing
